

Black (Presbyterian) History Month As our country celebrates Black History Month and the often untold stories of the African American impact on our shared history, DCPC is remembering the contributions of African American Presbyterians. Mary McLeod Bethune was an American activist, humanitarian, and--above all--an educator. Born on July 10, 1875 in South Carolina, Mary was the fifteenth of seventeen children. After attending several schools, including Scotia College, Mary established Daytona Educational and Industrial Training School for Negro Girls. It eventually became Bethune-Cookman University, one of America's HBCUs. She died in 1955.
